Graduate Scholarship for Non-Japanese Women to Study in Japan 2010-2011

APPLICATION FORMS AND INSTRUCTIONS

BEFORE YOU BEGIN: The attached forms must be used when applying to the College Women’s Association of Japan (CWAJ) Graduate Scholarship Program for Non-Japanese Women to Study in Japan. If you wish to apply for the scholarship, carefully check the eligibility requirements listed below.

Please note

- *You must meet each requirement in order to qualify for the scholarship. CWAJ allows no exceptions to these requirements.**
- *You may not apply from abroad.**
- *Neither your application nor anything else you send to us will be returned. Any materials in addition to those requested in this application will be disregarded.**

I. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Graduate Scholarship for Non-Japanese Women to Study in Japan (NJG Program): 2 Scholarships, ¥2 Million each

1. Applicants must be non-Japanese, non-permanent resident women who will be enrolled in a degree program with a graduate school of a Japanese university from **April 2010 to March 2011**.
2. Applicants must be residing in Japan for study purposes at the time of application.
3. Applicants must have adequate ability in Japanese, as well as in English.
4. Holders of scholarships greater than ¥1.0 million from any other scholarship foundation or from company scholarship programs (*kigyo ryugaku*) are ineligible. Financial aid and awards from the university where the applicant will study are excepted from this limitation.
5. Former recipients of CWAJ awards and members of CWAJ are ineligible.

II. INTERVIEWS AND SELECTION

Interviews of the finalists will be held in Tokyo. You should plan to be available during the month when interviews are being held (see the timetable below). You will be notified at least two weeks in advance if you have been selected for an interview. Finalists who are traveling from more than 100 km outside Central Tokyo will receive a transportation subsidy from CWAJ. The interview will be conducted in English. Applicants will be notified of the results in writing. CWAJ’s methods, rankings and judgments are proprietary and totally confidential. CWAJ does not enter into any discussion of its decisions.

IV. INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING CWAJ SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION FORMS

Form 1 – Application for Scholarship

1. *Personal Information.* Fill in all items. Address for Future Reference should be an address where you expect to be able to receive mail for the next several years – for example, the address of parents or close relatives.
2. *Current and Proposed Study Program.* Fill in all information that applies.
3. *Financial Information.* List all forms of financial aid you have received during your education, including current and promised aid. Indicate the beginning and ending dates of the periods during which you received each form of financial aid. In the second space, list scholarships you have applied for but have not yet received.
4. *Previous Education.* Include all previous educational institutions attended since high school, whether or not a degree was granted.
5. *Work/Volunteer/Other Experience.* Use this space for significant extracurricular as well as work and volunteer experience. Please account for any period longer than three months when you were not working or in school. Attach additional sheets if necessary.
6. *Significant Publications, Presentations, Honors and Awards.* Include both academic and non-academic awards and honors. Information on published work should include name and date of publication, and publisher. Indicate whether presentations were refereed or non-refereed. Attach *only* copies of abstracts or programs of presentation, and/or title pages of publications showing authors' names. Do not send publications.
7. *Previous International Experience.* Include all international assignments, travel, study, conferences or other experiences, except for brief vacations.

Form 2 – Essay

Complete the essay **in English** using both pages of Form 2. **Attach a Japanese translation** of no more than 1000 ji. Confine your essay to the space allowed on the form. Your essay may be word-processed or handwritten and may be completed on another sheet of paper and pasted to Form 2, *but it must not exceed 750 words*. Sign your application on the second page of the form.

Form 3 – Two Letters of Reference

Give a copy of Form 3 to two different professors and/or employers or other persons who know you well in an academic or professional capacity. Remind them that references must be in English or have an English translation attached. **Each original must be sealed in an envelope marked “Confidential.”** The referee should sign or stamp across the envelope seal and returned the sealed envelope to you for inclusion in your application. The person completing the reference must not be a relative or personal friend.

Follow the application checklist on the next page **exactly**.

Any application that fails to comply with these requirements and deadlines will be disqualified.

APPLICATION CHECKLIST

- **Your application must include ALL of the following documents (a to e) in one envelope, clearly marked “APPLICATION ENCLOSED, NJG PROGRAM”.**
- Any document that is **NOT IN ENGLISH** must be accompanied by **an English translation**.
- No documents will be returned.

- a) **One (1) original set plus two (2) copies of your assembled application (total of 3 sets)**, each application set must include, in the following order:
 - i) **Form 1**, Completed CWAJ Application.
 - ii) **Form 2**, Essay, English and Japanese versions.
 - iii) **Certified Transcripts in English**, including transcripts of any transferred credits, from **every undergraduate and graduate university** you have attended (past or present), along with an explanation of the marking system. This explanation is crucial for the Selection Committee to properly understand each transcript. If your university has an official document explaining its system, please include it. If it has none, ask the university to provide a brief explanation or do your best to explain it yourself.
- b) **Two (2) CWAJ Letters of Reference (Form 3)**, completed by two different professors and/or employers or persons who know you well in an academic or professional capacity.
- c) **One (1) certification of university enrolment (zaigaku shomeisho) or other proof of acceptance to or enrolment in a degree program**. If you are currently a kenkyusei, also send proof of your status. If you have not yet been accepted to a degree program, indicate when you expect to be notified. A photocopy of student ID will not be accepted.
- d) **Two (2) envelopes (12cm x 23.5cm) with your name and current address in Japan with the postal code printed on them** and an **¥80 stamp** affixed to each.
- e) **¥1000 yubin ko-gawase** for handling costs. (You can obtain it at a post office. Do not write anything on it.) **NO CASH OR STAMPS WILL BE ACCEPTED.**
